Winning the regionals has earned the "Darite Virtual Pros" a place to compete at the National Finals in Harrogate, against all the other regional winners from across the whole of the UK in the summer term. Free School Meals (FSM)

Please check to see if your child is entitled to receive free school meals as it not only helps your child but also the school receive additional funding to provide additional resources for the whole school to enjoy.

All reception, year 1 and year 2 children are eligible for universal infant free school meals (UIFSM). You don't need to do anything for your child to receive these. However, if you are in receipt of the qualifying benefits listed below, you may be eligible for benefit related free school meals (FSM) if your child is aged 2, 3 or 4 (not yet in reception class) and is attending sessions both before and after lunch on that day or if your child is in year 3 and above.

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

Your child may also be entitled to free school meals (FSM) if you receive any of these benefits and your child is both:

- younger than the compulsory age for starting school
- in full-time education

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2025.

Even if you do not want your child to eat the meal, by applying for free school meals you help your child's school who will receive extra funding. It is also possible to send your child to school with a packed lunch of your own and add to it with food from the school kitchen.
