The children continue to flourish in our schools producing some remarkable work and can talk enthusiastically about their learning. ### Ofsted

Last term we had visits to Harrowbarrow, Lanlivery and Looe. This Spring Term has seen another wave of Ofsted visits across the Trust. At the beginning of January Darite and Polruan welcomed Ofsted into their schools to share how children's learning is flourishing within the classroom. Since Polruan's previous report we are delighted they were awarded 'Good' across all areas of the inspection. Darite also remains a 'Good' school with the Ofsted report confirming the school has taken effective action to maintain the standards identified at the previous inspection. Last week it was Polperro's turn, and this week Copper Valley Infant and Nursery have also welcomed Ofsted Inspectors. We look forward to receiving and sharing the full reports for both these schools in due course.

It is heartwarming to hear our parents and carers are positive about the quality of education at our schools and that our staff are overwhelmingly positive about the support we can offer them in their work.

We are all extremely proud of these results, it is a clear testament to the hard work and dedication of all our children, staff and the wider community.

### Lego Champions!

On Thursday 13th of March, the team of Year 5 and 6 pupils from Darite Primary Academy the Darite Marine Marvels- were crowned champions in the First Lego League Robot Performance at RNAS Culdrose for the fourth year running!



The team of 7 children competed against 24 other primary schools on the second day of the two-day competition. The theme this year was "Submerged".

The day included the children having to invent, develop and present an "Innovation Project" that would support the research of scientists studying oceanography. The team contacted scientists at NOAA in America and the Marine Biological Association (MBA) in Plymouth. After an amazing Q and A with Professor David Sims and Dr Freya

Womersley at the MBA, during which they learned about the cutting-edge research being done in Plymouth, the team decided to look at ways they could support the MBA team with extending battery life in the tags. This is one of the many challenges facing Professor Sims and his team as they explained.

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The MBA team are using tags to track shark species including whale sharks - the data from which, support research in climate change and human impact on the oceans. The children chose to look at how batteries in the tags could be recharged, extending the life of the tag, gathering more data and allow scientists to make tags smaller to track juvenile sharks. The team discussed several ideas such as solar panels on tags until they settled on adapting hydroelectric turbines into miniature impellors that could be attached to tags. The judges on the day were very impressed with their ideas and display of teamwork.



Along with this aspect of the competition, there was a science show, interactive exhibits such as electric art, rocket making and coding. The Navy personnel were only too happy to help, and the children were very impressed with the drones on display.

The second aspect of the competition was the Robot Game. This was a coding competition - the participants had to build and code a robot from a set number of Lego pieces to move around a mat, interacting with Lego obstacles and scoring points.

Scoring a huge total of 310 points the team from Darite Primary were very proud to win the coding phase of the competition and were awarded the trophy for the Robot Performance for the fourth time in a row!

There was very strong competition over the two days with more than 50 teams competing. The Darite Marine Marvels- were awarded the highest placed runners-up and as such, we are really proud to announce that the team will be attending the National Finals in Harrogate for the second year in a row!



We are also proud of Harrowbarrow Primary who attended the event on the second day and won the Judges Award for good effort and positivity. Thanks to the team at the MBA ([www.mba.ac.uk](http://www.mba.ac.uk)), Cornwall Council and RNAS Culdrose for their support in making the project a great success.

This week the Darite Marine Marvels were interviewed by BBC Radio Cornwall further to them hearing about their success story in the local press. Congratulations and good luck for the National Finals!

### World's toughest row across the Atlantic

Also, this term Bridge Schools Trustee, Sally Crabb completed an amazing challenge of rowing across the Atlantic in support of the RNLI. Representing the UK, as part of a team Sally rowed an astounding 3000 miles to cross the finish line in Antigua in: 40 days, 16 hours and 48 minutes, coming an incredible **1st in the mixed class category**.

In addition, we have invested in teacher iPads as we look to introduce new and exciting software next term during our June INSET in preparation for the new academic year to enhance learning in classrooms.
