Dear Parents and Carers,

This term has been especially busy across all the schools but has concluded positively for all the children, staff and parents across Bridge Schools. I hope you have been able to enjoy some of the Christmas performances, carol concerts and activities in the calendar to celebrate the festive season.

Bridge Schools has seen Ofsted visits for several schools within the Trust. The staff and children from Harrowbarrow had a one-day monitoring visit which went well. Lanlivery received a one-day inspection and rightly retained their GOOD – the report has been published. Looe had the pleasure of a two-day visit; we await the final report but suffice it to say, 'we are pleased.' Heads and the teams pulled out all the stops to show the schools off at their very best. Staff from across the Trust were able to support, just as they do with all our schools.

### **Digital learning and IT investment**

With recent Trust Board approval for a further investment of £158k in IT we will continue to add to provision in schools for both pupils and teachers. In terms of pupil ratio, we already provide 1:1 iPads in small schools and 1:2 in most of the medium and larger schools. With this further approved investment, we can upgrade our IT resource within the Trust.

### **Premises**

We continue to invest in our school buildings with an extensive programme of compliance management, capital works and maintenance. 12 applications for major capital projects at 9 of our schools have just been submitted to the 25/26 Condition Improvement Fund (CIF) totalling £3.03m. Minor capital works have been completed across all sites this year totalling in excess of £161k, we always want more but are pleased with the improvements.

### **Financial Squeeze**

Although we are still facing added pressures to school budgets with ever increasing costs, we are in the fortunate position of securing a 'reserve' to support the schools through any difficulties which may arise – a benefit of pooling our monies together. The reserve is used to reinvest back into premises and IT as detailed above as well as additional learning resources schools might need.

### **Partnerships between home and school**

Many of us are encountering financial difficulties and we understand this can create pressure with keeping a family well fed, watered, warm and clothed, especially at Christmas. If you are having any challenges like this, please talk to staff at school as we can often help. We have links to many organisations that can support with food, transport, and other help. A big thank you to all families who are speaking to us regularly to keep their children attending school as much as possible. As of today, the trust wide attendance is 94% (better than this time last year) but still behind the national percentage target of 95%. We continue to review our approach to attendance and welcome you talking to us about what works best to support you.

### **Keeping fit and healthy**

At the end of November, it was great to see our children join together for a Trust wide football tournament at Callywith College. The children could see the opportunities that may be on offer for them as possible future learners and also met some of the Callywith students who were assisting with the tournament as part of their Sports Leader Award. The children were an absolute credit to you all, showing a fantastic attitude towards fair play but still with a competitive edge. Demonstrating our Trust values in action, there were some very determined children (and adults coaching from the side-lines!) who gave it their all. A great opportunity for everyone to show off their talents.



Group games drew together for the quarter, then semi-finals, with Copper Valley Juniors vs Looe in the final. A big well done to Looe Primary for their win. All of us working collaboratively across the Trust, means we can offer the children opportunities like this to come together, have fun and enjoy some physical activity along the way. Well done everyone you are all superstars!

### Central Team

Our small central team of staff support all 15 schools with all technical queries around finance, HR, IT, Premises and general enquiries around legal issues, contracts and information management for schools. John Wareham our IT Chief retires at the end of the month after 12 years of service with us. He has added so much to the Trust to provide opportunities for children and staff in the digital world for which we are all grateful. We all wish him the very best for a long and happy retirement. Heléna Weeks has been with us for 6 years working in HR. Her gentle and thoughtful manner has helped us over the years. We wish Heléna well in her new position, working for an international multi academy trust.

There's even been a cheeky visit from Twinkl the elf on what was a fabulous Elf Day at St Cleer in support of Alzheimer's UK.


